A religious and culturally sensitive approach to the Duke of Edinburgh's Award

he JLGB is the exclusive Jewish Operating Authority for the Duke of Edinburgh's Award (DofE) and has been since its inception in 1956. The JLGB has an excellent track record of providing expedition training and assessment programmes that meet the religious and cultural needs of Jewish young people, removing all barriers for the successful completion of their award.

Enrolling and directly training over 700 young Jewish people each year, many thousands of young Jewish people have achieved their Bronze, Silver and Gold awards through the JLGB.

The increased awareness and interest in the DofE has helped to encourage many young people from the ultra-orthodox Jewish communities to take part in DofE, particularly those who require single-gender expedition provision.

Tremendous support is also given by the JLGB to young people with physical or learning disabilities who want to be part of all that DofE offers.



# AIMING HIGH FOR JEWISH YOUTH


Accredited leadership training, skills development and lifelong learning

he JLGB helps Jewish young people to develop transferable skills that they'll be able to use throughout their lives - skills such as character building, self-confidence, teamwork and a sense of ownership and responsibility.

JLGB leadership training programmes, accredited by the National Open College Network (NOCN), cover a vast range of transferable life skills, all of which are vital for young people's further education and future career opportunities. Examples of these skills include:

- Personal development and social awareness
- Peer leadership, teamwork and communication
- Activity organisation, event planning and risk
- Situation management, safeguarding and child protection
- Money management and informed decision making Jewish identity, heritage and peoplehood
- Citizenship, social action and intergenerational
- Motivational techniques and presentation skills

In today's highly competitive world, these transferable skills are invaluable in giving each young person the competitive edge they need to enhance their career progression and improve employability.

The JLGB gives young people the opportunity to showcase what they can do and to stand out as shining examples in their communities. The JLGB takes tremendous pride in the achievements of the hundreds of young people involved in thousands of hours of impactful volunteering and social action programmes.

## REACHING OUT AND ENGAGING COMMUNITIES

A sustainable model for positive youth provision in Jewish communities across the UK

A cross the UK, the JLGB offers a positive, balanced programme of weekly activities which engage young people in important life choices and issues such as healthy living, citizenship, emotional well-being, leadership development and Jewish identity.

Our work in small Jewish communities such as Cardiff, Liverpool, Newcastle and Glasgow shows how the JLGB national network acts as a vital lifeline for isolated young people who wouldn't otherwise get the chance to meet and make friends with hundreds of like-minded Jewish teenagers from other communities.

Modern day technology has allowed the JLGB for the first time to interact with smaller Jewish communities in a different way. With the creation of online programmes and training resources we have been able to create 'virtual' communities that allow us to reach out and directly connect, support and encourage the development of 'hard to reach' young Jewish people.

All our national award schemes have been upgraded and are accessible online through secure, user friendly systems that young people and volunteers can access in order to track their individual progress and achievement. The delivery of these cutting edge programmes, to even the smallest rural Jewish communities, instantly and directly connects these isolated young people to all the JLGB family has to offer.



### EVERY CHILD REALLY DOES MATTER

Actively supporting children and families in need to access positive youth provision

s a national, but grass roots youth organisation working directly in almost every Jewish community, the JLGB is acutely aware of the issues affecting today's young people. The JLGB helps families in need by creating a safe space for their children where they can explore their true self and enjoy their transition to adulthood in a fun and welcoming environment away from outside worries and pressures.

The JLGB has always ensured that no young person or volunteer leader is prevented from participating in any JLGB programme due to personal, financial or family circumstances.

Over 30% of the young people and volunteer leaders we engage with receive a variety of financial subsidies or individual welfare support. Year on year, the amount of bursaries the JLGB has awarded to children, young people and families in need has grown significantly - a trend that is increasing in this difficult financial climate.

Working closely with Special Educational Needs schools such as Langdon College, the JLGB continues to grow its provision for Jewish children with physical and learning disabilities by offering specially adapted programmes that are accessible, inclusive and empowering.

### INVESTING IN JEWISH YOUTH


Help us to develop the next generation into well-rounded thoughtful and active citizens
